#### DRIVES & GOODY BAG COLLECTIONS

While TPCS offers a best-in-class emergency shelter coupled with our life-changing programs and services that empower our moms for success; companies and membership groups can help by organizing drives and holiday goody bag collections. We are always in need of new towels and washcloths, hygiene products, baby items, new undergarments amd socks, cleaning products, laundry detergent, and new or gently used clothing and coats.

### **IN-KIND DONATIONS** FOR OUR EMERGENCY SHELTER FACILITY – SERVANT'S HOUSE

Thank you for your commitment to empowering our residents and helping to spread joy. Our annual collections for the shelter facility directly benefit the mothers and children staying with us and those participating in our Continued Support Program.

Donors receive social media and website recognition. Items provided by donors can include their branding. Larger contributors can receive PR and photo ops with the staff and Executive Director.

For the privacy of our residents, TPCS does not provide photos of our clients or offer entry to our secured facility. Welcome Package (Donations received on a recurring basis)

At the initial arrival time, many moms and their children come to us with little to nothing. As such we supply each family with a care package. Each Welcome Package includes personal hygiene items for the family, washcloths, towels, water bottles, and non-perishable snacks. TPCS provides baby items and apparel when needed as well. 70 packages are needed each year.

**Collection Box Opportunities** (*Donations received on a recurring basis*) Collections include dishwashing detergent, laundry detergent, hand soap, household cleaning products, cases of water bottles, diapers, formula, spices, cooking oils, paper goods, and laptops (in good working condition).

## IN-KIND DONATIONS CONTINUED

#### **Easter** (Commitment to support deadline Jan 3)

The Easter bunny comes to the shelter to hand out baskets and hugs for all. Easter baskets for 50 youth are requested. 24-27 baskets of food for the families are welcomed as well.

**Mother's Day Goody Bags** (*Commitment to support deadline March 15*) All moms deserve appreciation for all that they do for their children. 25 reusable goody bags filled with candy, socks, body lotion, body scrub, hand lotion, a face mask, a shower cap, a coin purse, a small toiletry bag, lip balm, and a nail kit are requested for this special day of recognition.

**Back-to-School Initiative** (*Commitment to support deadline May 30*) Every school-age child/teen receives a backpack filled with basic school supplies and other goodie items such as stickers and erasers. Supports 50 youth.

#### Halloween (Commitment to support deadline July 15)

For the safety of all, children trick-or-treat in the Servant's House facility visiting the decorated social spaces managed by the staff. The underwriter(s) can shop for decorations, candy and the children's requested gently-used or new costumes. Supports approximately 60 children.

#### Adopt-A-Family for the Holidays (Commitment to support deadline July 30)

During the holiday season we like to offer our families something extra special - a new toy, a new article of clothing, an item they've truly desired throughout the year. With your help, we are able to accomplish just that! Each family is asked to provide us with their holiday wish list (families range from 2-5 members). Sponsors are able to select families based on size and are asked to supply wrapped presents based on the families' wish list items. Sponsors also have the option to donate gift cards for families. Supports up to 27 families.

#### Thanksgiving (Commitment to support deadline August 1)

Each family is given a non-perishable fixings food basket and an 8-10lb turkey or chicken. For those remaining in the facility for the holiday, our staff cooks a Thanksgiving meal. Supports 27 families that range in size + some RAs and recent past residents.

### **SPONSOR-A-ROOM** ENSURE A POSITIVE & SECURE SPACE FOR ALL

Prior to the new arrival of a mother and her family in our shelter facility, TPCS swiftly turns their private room around with a fresh coat of paint, fixes/renews fixtures, provides new bedding/towels and other family necessities.

While our clients reside with us, they have access to supportive services and communal spaces that support independence and aid in their transition out of homelessness. It is TPCS' goal for all moms to become independent and stable within 4-6 months while staying at our facility.

By supporting this annual campaign, you are helping to make a meaningful difference towards the living environments for our clients residing in our shelter.

#### 24 Bedrooms each at \$3,000

Just \$8 a day for maintenance, upgrades and supplies per room per family. Please note that our facility is a non-congregate shelter, meaning each family has their own private room.

#### 8 Units each at \$5,000

Just \$14 a day for maintenance, upgrades and supplies per unit per group of families. Each unit consists of a kitchenette, bathroom and living room.

#### Laundry Room at \$5,000

Includes supplies, cost for families' use of machines, utility, and maintenance. This is a communal space.

#### Full Kitchen at \$7,500

Includes food basket per entry of families in need, utility, maintenance of appliances, and kitchenware. This is a communal space.

#### Day Room at \$10,000

Includes maintenance, toys, electronics, reading materials, and parenting groups. This is a communal space.
